BOOK 500 - BEEF FITTING

CLASS 1 - SENIOR BEEF FITTING (Age 15 and over)
CLASS 2 - INTERMEDIATE BEEF FITTING (Age 12-14 inclusive)
CLASS 3 - JUNIOR BEEF FITTING (Age 11 and under)

MARKET STEERS AND FEEDER CALF SHOW

1. All market steers must be weighed, tagged, noseprinted and ownership certificates completed on February 5, 2005.

2. Market steers and feeder calves must have been castrated surgically cut or banded, not clamped. Market steers and feeders must be hornless, polled, and have no scars.

3. Market steers must weigh a minimum of 900 pounds. Steers weighing under the limit will show in a separate class. Steers under 900 pounds will not be eligible for "Grand Champion".

4. If the exhibitor's market steer was born and raised in Coshocton County or on the farm of a Coshocton County Junior Fair exhibitor, the animal also may be entered and shown in the County-Bred and Raised Market Steer Class. This class is to earn more recognition for exhibitors with locally produced cattle. Only a Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected with no further placings. These animals will NOT sell as champions at the Junior Fair Sale. These animals must be from Book 501.

Grooming of all Jr. Fair beef animals is limited to the member, Jr. Fair exhibitors, immediate family members, and advisor residing in Coshocton County. Exhibitor may enter a maximum of two market heifers and two market steers.

BOOK 501 - MARKET BEEF SHOW

CLASS 1 - MARKET HEIFER

First place winner of hip height classes.

CHAMPION MARKET HEIFER

RESERVE CHAMPION MARKET HEIFER

CLASS 2 - MARKET STEER

First-place winner of hip height classes.

GRAND CHAMPION MARKET BEEF

RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION MARKET BEEF

CLASS 3 - COUNTY BRED & RAISED MARKET STEER

Champion and Reserve Champion selected only.

FEEDER CALF CLASSES

1. Animals must be steers (not heifers or bulls) born after Jan. 1, 2005, and in possession and care of the exhibitor by June 18 of the current year. Feeder calves must be tagged on June 18 at the Feeder Calf Tag-In. Feeder calves must have a halter on when brought to the Feeder Calf Tag-In just inside the Seventh Street gate at the county fairgrounds.
2. All feeder calves must weigh a minimum of 350 pounds. Feeders weighing under the limit will show in a separate class, will not be eligible for Champion or Reserve Champion. Feeder calves must weigh 350 pounds to sell through the auction ring.
3. The top five feeder calves in the Large 1, Medium 1 and Small 1 grade classes will be placed and class winners presented a trophy. A Champion and Reserve Champion Feeder Calf will be selected and have the option to sell through the Junior Fair Sale.
4. All feeder calves must be treated by a veterinarian at least 21 days before the start of the fair as follows: Vaccinated for IBR and P13; vaccinated for BVD; vaccinated for seven-way Clostridia; and treated for internal parasites with Eprinex. These

requirements must be met to show in the Junior Fair Beef Show Feeder Calf Classes or sell at the Coshocton County Junior Fair Sale.

5. Exhibitor may enter a maximum of two beef feeder calves and two dairy feeder calves.
6. One third of the market steers and market heifers will be selected for the Carcass Show with a maximum of ten animals.

Born between Sept. 1 and Dec. 31, 2004

CLASS 3 - SUMMER YEARLING HEIFER

Born between May 1 and Aug. 31, 2004

CLASS 4 - JUNIOR YEARLING HEIFER

Born between Jan. 1 and April 30, 2004

CLASS 5 - SENIOR YEARLING HEIFER

Born between Sept. 1 and Dec. 31, 2003

CLASS 6 - BEEF COW

Born prior to Aug. 31, 2003, or already freshened

CHAMPION FEMALE

(First-place animals from Class 1 through 6 by breed.)

RESERVE CHAMPION FEMALE

(Judge may request second-place animal from class where the champion was selected to be brought in for reserve competition.)

SUPREME FEMALE

CLASS 3 - INTERMEDIATE SHOWMANSHIP 13 & 14

Ages 13 and 14 inclusive and winners of Intermediate Showmanship 11 and 12

CLASS 4 - INTERMEDIATE SHOWMANSHIP 11 & 12

Ages 11 and 12 inclusive and winners of Junior Showmanship 10 and Under

CLASS 5 - JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP

Age 10 and Under

CLASS 6 - FIRST-YEAR SHOWMANSHIP

Age 12 and under with no Junior Fair Beef Show experience
Not eligible for Classes 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5

CLASS 7 - SUPREME SHOWMANSHIP

Winners of Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 this year and previous winners of Senior Showmanship 17 & 18 or Supreme Showmanship. Any Showman awarded first place in Supreme Showmanship after 1996 may only show in the Supreme Showmanship class thereafter.

RATE OF GAIN

1. All Market Steers must be weighed on February 5, 2005.
2. Each Exhibitor may weigh up to three animals.
3. All animals must weigh a minimum of 900 pounds at time of fair.
4. Five Rate of Gain trophies will be awarded to exhibitors of the top five gaining market steers regardless of breed. The top overall gainer will receive a larger trophy.

OLD TIMERS BEEF SHOWMANSHIP

This class is open to anyone who is 19 years of age or older. Showman is required to be a 4-H or FFA parent, Advisor, sponsor or involved in Coshocton County 4-H or FFA activities during the past year. Judging will be strictly on the showmanship of the individual and not on the animal. It is NOT required that the showman own the animal which they exhibit in this class. The class may be divided if necessary.
