BOOK 520 - SHEEP FITTING

(See Fitting Rules)

CLASS 1 - SENIOR SHEEP FITTING (Age 14 and over)

CLASS 2 - JUNIOR SHEEP FITTING (Age 13 and under)

BOOK 521 - MARKET LAMB SHOW

1. All market lambs must be tagged on the Market Lamb Weigh-in Day on June 17-18.

2. Market lambs must weigh a minimum of 80 pounds. Lambs weighing under the minimum will show in a separate class. Lambs under the minimum weight will not be eligible for "Grand Champion".

3. Market lamb classes can be divided by weight at the discretion of the superintendent. All weight sections are considered an entry in Class 1.

Market lambs must be slick shorn with a maximum of ¼ inch of wool. Wool length will be checked at the fair weigh-in. Exhibitor may enter and bring to the Junior Fair Sheep Show a maximum of two single market lambs.

4. An exhibitor may enter a Pen of Two Market Lambs which are also the single market lamb entries. Both lambs must individually meet the weight requirements or the pen will not be eligible for champion or reserve champion.

**CLASS 1 - SINGLE MARKET LAMB
CHAMPION MARKET LAMB**

First-place winner of eligible weight classes.

**CLASS 2 - EXHIBITOR HOME BRED, BORN & RAISED
MARKET LAMB**

Exhibitor or exhibitor's immediate family is to own and have bred the ewe that produces the market lamb. The exhibitor is not to purchase a bred ewe to produce the market lamb for this class. (Market lamb must also be exhibitor's market lamb entry).

CLASS 3 - PEN OF TWO MARKET LAMBS

Both lambs in the Pen of Two must have been weighed and tagged at the June Market Lamb Tag/Weigh In and at least one of the lambs must be a single market lamb entry.

SHEEP BREEDING SHOW

Age of breeding ewes will be determined by the judge mouthing the animals. Sheep need not be registered to show in breeding classes but should be of a recognized sheep breed.

CLASS 1 - SENIOR SHOWMANSHIP 17 & 18

Ages 17 and 18 and winners of Senior Showmanship 15 and 16

CLASS 2 - SENIOR SHOWMANSHIP 15 & 16

Age 15 and 16 and winners of Intermediate Showmanship 13 and 14

CLASS 3 - INTERMEDIATE SHOWMANSHIP 13 & 14

Ages 13 and 14 inclusive and winners of Intermediate Showmanship 11 and 12

CLASS 4 - INTERMEDIATE SHOWMANSHIP 11 & 12

Ages 11 and 12 inclusive and winners of Junior Showmanship

CLASS 5 - JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP

Age 10 and under

CLASS 6 - FIRST -YEAR SHOWMANSHIP

Age 12 and under with no Junior Fair Sheep Show experience

Not eligible for classes 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5.

CLASS 7 - SUPREME SHOWMANSHIP

Winners of Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 this year and previous winners of Senior Showmanship 17 & 18 or Supreme Showmanship. Any Showman awarded first place in Supreme Showmanship after 1996 may only show in the Supreme Showmanship class thereafter.

OLD TIMERS SHEEP SHOWMANSHIP

This class is open to anyone who is 19 years of age or older. Showman is required to be a 4-H or FFA parent, advisor, sponsor or involved in Coshocton County 4-H or FFA activities during the past year. Judging will be strictly on the showmanship of the individual and not on the animal. It is NOT required that the showman own the animal which they exhibit in this class. The class may be divided if necessary.

Entries in the lead classes are open to guys and gals living in Coshocton County in the age categories with sheep background or interest. There is no charge for entry. Age of contestant will be determined by age as of Jan. 1 of the current year.

Some part of the contestant's wearing apparel must be wool (does not necessarily need to be home-sewn). Contestants and their sheep are not to be decorated or wear costumes. Sheep must be conditioned, fitted and trained to show at halter. Breeding or market lambs can be used in all classes. (It is recommended that members exhibit a market lamb or breeding ewe lamb rather than a larger breeding ewe.)

The sheep in the lead class do not have to be kept on the fairgrounds the length of the fair. Sheep being brought in just for the lead class must enter the Denman Gate and go to the designated unloading area near the cable to be checked in by a veterinarian between 5 and 6 p.m.

Judging is based on (1) Entrant's outfit, poise and appearance. (2) Control and presentation of animal, and (3) Garment's suitability and originality.

Entry forms are available from the Coshocton County OSU Extension Office.

Classes will begin at 6:30 p.m. Oct. 4 in the Junior Fair Arena. Not being Junior Fair classes, premiums will not be paid for these classes. Winners of Classes A, D, E, F and G will receive a special award and five placing ribbons will be presented sponsored by the Coshocton Area Lamb and Fleece Improvement Committee. Participants in Classes B and C will receive participation awards, no placings.

BOOK 550 - MARKET HOG SHOW

1. Market hogs must weigh a minimum of 210 pounds and a maximum of 280 pounds. Market hogs weighing under 210 pounds and over 280 pounds will show in a separate class. These underweight and overweight market hogs will not be eligible for Grand Champion.

2. All market hog classes can be divided by weight at the discretion of the superintendent. All weight sections are considered an entry in Book 550 - Class 1.

3. No clipping of hair on market hogs after July 1 of the current year except ears, tails and underlines.

4. An exhibitor may enter two market hogs, one market barrow and one market gilt. Market gilts will be allowed to show in the Junior Fair Market Hog Show, but barrow weight classes will be separate from market gilt weight classes. A Champion and Reserve Champion Market Barrow will be selected and a Champion and Reserve Champion Market Gilt will be selected. These will compete for Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Market Hog which will sell in the auction. The top 12 market barrows and top 12 market gilts will compete for the top 16 market hogs overall for the Carcass Show.

Exhibitor or exhibitor's immediate family is to own and have the gilt or sow bred that produces the market hog. The exhibitor is not to purchase a bred gilt to produce the market hog for this class. (Must also be the exhibitor's Book 550 - Class 1 market barrow entry or Book 550 - Class 2 market gilt entry.)
