

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR OPEN CLASS STOCK LIVESTOCK

Entries close 5 p.m., **September 15.**

All exhibitors must purchase an exhibitor's ticket or membership ticket. An entry fee will be charged on all entries (singles and groups), to be paid to the secretary at the time of making the entry. Each exhibitor will be limited to two entries in singles and one entry in groups. All animals must be bona fide property of the exhibitor, except where otherwise specified. All animals must be registered, with the exception of Dairy animals owned by county residents, and BOOK 40 CROSS BRED BEEF CATTLE.

Non-registered Dairy animals may be shown by Coshocton County residents only.

Where animals are of an inferior quality, the judges shall refuse to award premiums, even though there be competition, and in any case where the animal is not deemed worthy of first premium, the judges shall not award higher than second premium. In all cases, the exhibit must be of sufficient merit to warrant an award of any kind being made.

All entries must be in place by **10 p.m.**

Friday, September 28, 2007. Animals are brought on the grounds at owner's risk. The Fairboard assumes no liability for accidents, but will do anything possible to avoid them. Exhibitors who do not abide by the rules of any department will be barred. Livestock will be released on Thursday as follows:

- 12 noon - Horses, Dairy
- 1 p.m. - Swine
- 2 p.m. - Sheep, Goats
- 3 p.m. - Beef
- 4 p.m. - Small Animals.

If exhibitor has more than one species, then all exhibits will be released at the later time.

 24. Pair of Yearlings - 1 bull, 1 heifer, from junior yearling and summer yearling classes
 25. Get of Sire - 4 animals, both sexes represented, get of one sire
 26. Two Heifers - any age, bred and owned by exhibitor
 27. Two Bulls - any ages, bred and owned by exhibitor
 28. Produce of Dam - two animals, from above classes, either sex, any age, produce of cow, owned by exhibitor
- Grand Champion Female of All Breeds - Rosette

BOOK 49A - OPEN FEEDER CALF CLASS (Open to All) (Judged following county market class)

1. All Feeder Calves will be weighed following the Jr. Fair weigh-in Saturday morning.
2. All Feeder Calves must be treated at least 21 days before the start of the fair as follows: Vaccinated for IBR and P13; vaccinated for BVD; vaccinated for seven-way Clostridia; treated for internal parasites with Eprinex.
3. Junior Fair exhibitors bringing more than one animal will house their open class animals together in the open class barn.
