SCHOOL DISPLAY

All work displayed by only state accredited schools of Coshocton County, must be completed since the preceding county fair.

Premiums to be paid by check from the County School Office to each individual school.

Exhibitors must arrange their own work under the direction of the county school office. A Rosette will be awarded to Best Overall High School, Jr. High, and Grade School Display.

CLASS A - Junior High - High School

Premiums: A. \$45; B. \$35; C. \$30

Six individual students premiums of \$2.50 each to be awarded to the student exhibits in each school display that best fits each of the criteria listed under the basis for judging individual student premiums. A student can win only one premium in each display area.

The basis for judging the individual booths shall be as follows:

1. Extent and organization of student work.
2. Originality and creativity.
3. Comprehensiveness and unity.
4. General attractiveness and arrangement.
5. Neatness and appearance of display.
6. Junior High and High Schools will be assigned curricular areas from the list below from which the fair displays are to be made.

Schools will not be assigned areas in which instruction is not provided.

JUDGING, FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 28, 2007 - 12 noon

Exhibits are limited to residents of Coshocton County only. The purchase of an exhibitor's ticket will entitle any Coshocton County resident to make entries in single entry classes. Single entries in this department must be of current year's growth. The same item cannot be entered or compete in more than one class.

Displays: An entry fee of 10 percent of the perfect score premium will be charged on all displays. Entry fees for Grange displays are \$20.00 for Subordinate Granges Displays and \$5.00 for Junior Grange Displays.

Entry fees are to be paid to the secretary at the time entries are made. Every article in this department, entered singularly or in a display, must be labeled true to name and in place by 10 p.m., Thursday, **September 27, 2007.**

Where articles are of an inferior quality, the judge shall refuse to award premiums, even though there be competition, and in any case where the articles are not deemed worthy of first premium, the judge shall not award higher than second premium. In all cases, the exhibit must be of sufficient merit to warrant an award of any kind being made. Judge's score to be used as premium settlement. No exhibits may be removed before 7:00 p.m. Thursday, **October 4, 2007.**
