**JUNIOR FAIR YOUTH GROUND ROPING**

Open to all Junior Fair exhibitors 9-18 years of age (ages are determined as of January 1 of the current year). Individuals will follow the rules of Junior Fair Ground Roping classes. Entries will be made the day of the show at the announcer's stand.

**THERAPEUTIC RIDING CLASS**

This non-competitive class is open to anyone with disabilities and special needs participating in equine-assisted activities. Animal will be ridden at a walk; however, at least one assistant MUST be in attendance with each rider. Entries will be made the day of the show at the announcer's stand.

**OLD TIMERS HORSE SHOWMANSHIP**

This fun-oriented class is open to anyone who is 19 years of age or older. They are required to be a 4-H or FFA parent, advisor, or involved in Coshocton County 4-H or FFA activities during the past year. It is not required that anyone must own the animal which they exhibit in this class. Entry will be made the day of the show.

There will be no high point of the day awarded.

1. Facilities for overnight care of cats are not available at the fairgrounds. Members carrying these projects may bring them in for their classes.

2. All cat projects must be owned by and in possession of Junior Fair exhibitor and enrolled as a project by June 1 of the current year.

3. Judging of small animals will be based on the following:

- a. Cleanliness of the animal.
- b. Condition of the animal for showing.
- c. Behavior of the animal - the owner should be able to handle the animal and it should be evident to the judge that the animal has been handled.
- d. Cat exhibitors also may be asked to place the cat in a cage provided on the judging table for the judge to examine the cat.

4. Any small animal may be disqualified if there is evidence of sickness, open sores, cuts or ear mites.

5. All cat exhibitors must turn into the OSU Extention Office office by September 1 a current certificate verifying that their cat(s) has been vaccinated by a veterinarian for rabies and distemper. A Feline Leukemia vaccination also is recommended.

6. Cats must be on a harness with leash while on the fairgrounds. Cats also need a nametag on the harness.

**CAT SHOWMANSHIP RULES**

(See Showmanship Rules)

The exhibitor must show evidence that he or she knows how to clip claws, check ears for mites, the proper way to handle the cat in a stressful situation, and the proper way to groom under the cat's belly, arms and around ears.

Exhibitors who have won Class 1 cannot re-enter that age

group, but are encouraged to enter Class 4. Exhibitors who have won Class 2 may enter Class 1 the following years until they win the class.

**BOOK 611 - CAT SHOWMANSHIP**

**CLASS 1 - SENIOR CAT SHOWMANSHIP**

Exhibitor 14 years or older and previous winners of Junior Showmanship.

**CLASS 2 - JUNIOR CAT SHOWMANSHIP**

Exhibitor 13 years and younger.

**CLASS 3 - FIRST YEAR-SHOWMANSHIP**

Age 12 and under with no Junior Fair Cat Show experience. Exhibitor not eligible for Classes 1 or 2.

**CLASS 4 - SUPREME CAT SHOWMANSHIP**

Winners of Classes 1, 2, and 3 this year and previous winners of Senior Showmanship or Supreme Showmanship.

**OLD TIMERS CAT SHOWMANSHIP**

This class is open to anyone who is 19 years of age or older. Showman is required to be a 4-H or FFA parent, advisor, sponsor or involved in Coshocton County 4-H or FFA activities during the past year. Judging will be strictly on the showmanship of the individual and not on the animal. It is NOT required that the showman own the animal which they exhibit in this class. The class may be divided if necessary.

1. An individual may have only one entry per class, with a maximum of four entries in the breeding classes and one market chicken in the market class, one in the turkey class, and one in the market duck class.

2. Market chickens must be:

A. From a group of at least five (5) market chickens raised by the 4-H or FFA member.

B. Hatched on or after August 11, the current year, with ownership into the Extension Office by August 23, the current year.

C. Owned, in sole possession of, and cared for by the exhibitor or their family within 72 hours after hatching.

D. Commercial type meat bird.

- E. Weigh between six and eight pounds.  
 F. Cockerel or pullet.  
 G. Free of disqualifying defects.
3. Turkey must be:  
 A. From a group of at least five (5) turkeys raised by the 4-H or FFA member.  
 B. Hatched between May 1 and May 15 of the current year, and have a signed Statement of ownership in to the OSU Extension Office by May 20 of the current year.  
 C. Owned, in sole possession of, and cared for by the exhibitor or their family within 72 hours after hatching.  
 D. Hen or Tom.  
 E. Free of disqualifying defects.
4. Market Duck must be:  
 A. Purchased through the Extension office and permanently identified from the hatchery in order to exhibit in the Junior Fair Poultry Show.  
 B. From a group of at least five (5) market ducks raised by the 4-H or FFA member.  
 C. Allowed breeds are Pekin, Aylesbury, Rouen, and Muscovy.  
 D. Hatched on or after August 11, the current year, with ownership into the Extension office by August 23 of the current year.
5. Market chickens must weigh between six and eight pounds. Market chickens not weighing six to eight pounds will show in a separate class.
6. All breeding poultry must be owned by July 1 of the current year.
7. Blood test certificates or NPIP papers must be presented for all breeding chickens before unloading. Poultry from NPIP (National Poultry Improvement Plan) farms will be exempt from blood testing. NPIP papers must be presented with the poultry projects at check-in.
8. Market Chickens and turkeys must be purchased from NPIP (National Poultry Improvement Plan) hatcheries and present NPIP papers before unloading.
9. Poultry will be checked for lice and mites. If an animal is found infected, the animal must be re-checked by a veterinarian.
10. Market chickens, market turkeys, and market ducks must show hatchery papers at fair weigh-in and must have a Coshocton County permanent identification band before weigh-in.
11. Ducks and geese do not require blood testing.
