

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR OPEN CLASS STOCK LIVESTOCK

- Entries close 5 p.m., September 17.
- All exhibitors must purchase an exhibitor's ticket or membership ticket.
- An entry fee will be charged on all entries (singles and groups), to be paid to the secretary at the time of making the entry.
- Each exhibitor will be limited to two entries in singles and one entry in groups.
- All animals must be bona fide property of the exhibitor, except where otherwise specified.
- All animals must be registered, with the exception of Dairy animals owned by county residents, and BOOK 40 CROSS BRED BEEF CATTLE. Non-registered Dairy animals may be shown by Coshocton County residents only.
- Where animals are of an inferior quality, the judges shall refuse to award premiums, even though there be competition, and in any case where the animal is not deemed worthy of first premium, the judges shall not award higher than second premium. In all cases, the exhibit must be of sufficient merit to warrant an award of any kind being made.
- All entries must be in place by 10 p.m. Friday, September 30, 2011.
- Animals are brought on the grounds at owner's risk. The Fairboard assumes no liability for accidents, but will do anything possible to avoid them.
- Exhibitors who do not abide by the rules of any department will be barred. Livestock will be released on Thursday as follows:
12 noon - Horses, Dairy
1 p.m. - Swine
2 p.m. - Sheep, Goats

3 p.m. - Beef
4 p.m. Small Animals. If exhibitor has more than one species, then all exhibits will be released at the later time.

Market Animals not entered by 9-17-11 deadline will be charged \$25.00 late charge in addition to the normal entry fee. No market animal entries permitted after species weight-in.

 2. All Feeder Calves must be treated at least 21 days before the start of the fair as follows: Vaccinated for IBR and P13; vaccinated for BVD; vaccinated for seven-way Clostridia; treated for internal parasites with Eprinex.
 3. Junior Fair exhibitors bringing more than one animal will house their open class animals together in the open class barn.
