CLASS 5 - SENIOR YEARLING HEIFER

Born between Sept. 1 and Dec. 31, 2010

CLASS 6 - BEEF COW

Born prior to Aug. 31, 2009, or already freshened

**MARKET STEERS
AND FEEDER CALF SHOW**

FEEDER CALF CLASSES

1. Animals must be steers (not heifers or bulls) born after Jan. 1, 2011, and in possession and care of the exhibitor by June 15 of the current year. Feeder Calves must be tagged on the third Saturday in June at the Feeder Calf Tag-In. Feeder calves must have a halter on when brought to the Feeder Calf Tag-In just inside the Seventh Street gate at the county fairgrounds.

2. All feeder calves must weigh a minimum of 350 pounds. Feeders weighing under the limit will show in a separate class and will not be eligible for Champion or Reserve Champion. Feeder calves must weigh 350 pounds to sell through the auction ring.

3. The top five feeder calves in the Large 1, Medium 1 and Small 1 grade classes will be placed and class winners presented a trophy. A Champion and Reserve Champion Feeder Calf will be selected and have the option to sell through the Junior Fair Sale.

4. All feeder calves must be treated at least 21 days before the start of the fair as follows: Vaccinated for IBR and PI3; vaccinated for BVD; vaccinated for seven-way Clostridia; and treated for internal parasites with Eprinex. These requirements must be met to show in the Junior Fair Beef Show Feeder Calf Classes or sell at the Coshocton County Junior Fair Auction.

5. Exhibitor may enter a maximum of two beef feeder calves and two dairy feeder calves.

Exhibitor or exhibitor's immediate family must own and breed the cow producing the beef feeder for this class. (Feeder must also be the exhibitor's Beef Feeder Calf entry).

BOOK 503 - DAIRY FEEDER CALF

CLASS 1 - DAIRY FEEDER - Total dairy breeding

GRAND CHAMPION DAIRY FEEDER CALF

RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION DAIRY FEEDER CALF

CLASS 2 - EXHIBITOR HOME BRED, BORN & RAISED DAIRY FEEDER CALF

Exhibitor or exhibitor's immediate family must own and breed the cow producing the dairy feeder for this class. (Feeder must also be the exhibitor's Dairy Feeder Calf entry.)

1. All market steers must be weighed, tagged, noseprinted and ownership certificates completed on the first Saturday in February.

2. Market steers and feeder calves must have been castrated surgically cut or banded, not clamped. Market steers and feeders must be hornless, polled, and have no scurs.

3. Market steers must weigh a minimum of 900 pounds. Steers weighing under the limit will show in a separate class. Steers under 900 pounds will be considered a feeder calf and compete in the feeder calf classes.

4. If the exhibitor's market steer was born and raised in Coshocton County or on the farm of a Coshocton County Junior Fair exhibitor, the animal also may be entered and shown in the County-Bred and Raised Market Steer Class. This class is to earn more recognition for exhibitors with locally produced cattle. Only a Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected with no further placings. These animals will NOT sell as champions at the Junior Fair Sale. These animals must be from Book 501.

5. Grooming of all Jr. Fair beef animals is limited to the member, Jr. Fair exhibitors, immediate family members, and advisor residing in Coshocton County.

6. Exhibitor may enter a maximum of two market heifers and two market steers.

7. The top ten market beef animals will be sent to the Junior Fair Carcass Show.

9. Junior Fair Market Beef Show Champion Drive- Selection of Grand Champion Market Beef, Reserve Grand Champion Market Beef and 8 additional market beef for the Carcass Show. After an exhibitor has one animal in the Champion Drive selected for the Carcass Show, then he has the choice to withdraw his second animal in that Champion Drive. Final placings of these market Champion Drives must go to the Carcass Show.

RATE OF GAIN

1. All Market Steers must be weighed on the first Saturday in February with the rain date the following Saturday.
2. Each Exhibitor may weigh up to three animals.
3. All animals must weigh a minimum of 900 pounds at time of fair.
4. Five Rate of Gain trophies will be awarded to exhibitors of the top five gaining market steers regardless of breed. The top overall gainer will receive a larger trophy.
