

Scouts, Boy Scouts, Junior Grange or Farm Bureau Youth. After August 1, applicants need to contact the Fairboard Office to schedule an interview time. Applications must be returned to the Fairboard Office no later than August 16. Interviews will be at the Fairboard Office by appointment only. Applicants will be interviewed by a Senior Fairboard selected committee. Awards provided for the King, Queen, and Court are sponsored by Dee's Gifts and Flowers, House of G.A. Fisher Jewelers, Liberty Pottery, and Olde Warehouse Restaurant in Roscoe Village. The Coshocton County Fair King and Queen are expected to represent Coshocton County at various Ohio fairs and festivals. The Queen will also represent Coshocton County at the Ohio Fair Queen Contest in January during the Ohio Fair Managers' Convention.

SHOWMAN OF SHOWMEN CONTEST

The Showman of Showmen Contest is for 4-H and FFA youth to enhance and encourage showmanship skills among multiple species. The event will start at 5:30pm on Wednesday, October 2nd in Hunter Arena. Only youth that win a Supreme Showmanship class in any of the following species are eligible to compete: beef, sheep, swine, dairy, horse goat, poultry, small animal, or rabbit. Each youth that participates will receive \$25, the overall winner will receive \$200. Once an exhibitor wins overall Showman of Showmen they are not eligible to participate in the contest again, it does not affect their species showmanship classes. If the supreme showmanship winner for a species opts to not participate, the second place winner may participate. If the second place winner opts to not participate, the species will not be represented in the Showman of Showmen contest and no further participants will be eligible. If one exhibitor wins Supreme Showmanship in two species, they must choose which species they will represent for the Showman of Showmen contest. The other livestock species will be shown in the contest but it will not have a youth representative.

PREMIER LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR

The Premier Livestock Exhibitors are chosen from a combination of Skillathon, Showmanship, and Live Animal judging. Skillathon scores must be received from participating in each species respective skillathon date; no pre or post evaluations will be accepted. One winner will be announced from each species: horse, dairy, goat, sheep, swine, beef, rabbit, poultry, dog, and small animal. Winners of each species will receive an embroidered director's chair. Winners will be announced after the Showman of Showmen Contest on Wednesday evening of the Coshocton County Fair.

QUALITY ASSURANCE TRAINING REQUIREMENT

All Junior Fair exhibitors with market or breeding projects in the Beef, Sheep, Swine, Dairy Cattle, Goats, Poultry, or Rabbits must attend the Coshocton County Quality Assurance Meeting or a quality assurance training approved by the Coshocton County Agricultural Society to enter the Junior Fair. Swine exhibitors must attend a Pork Quality Assurance III Session.

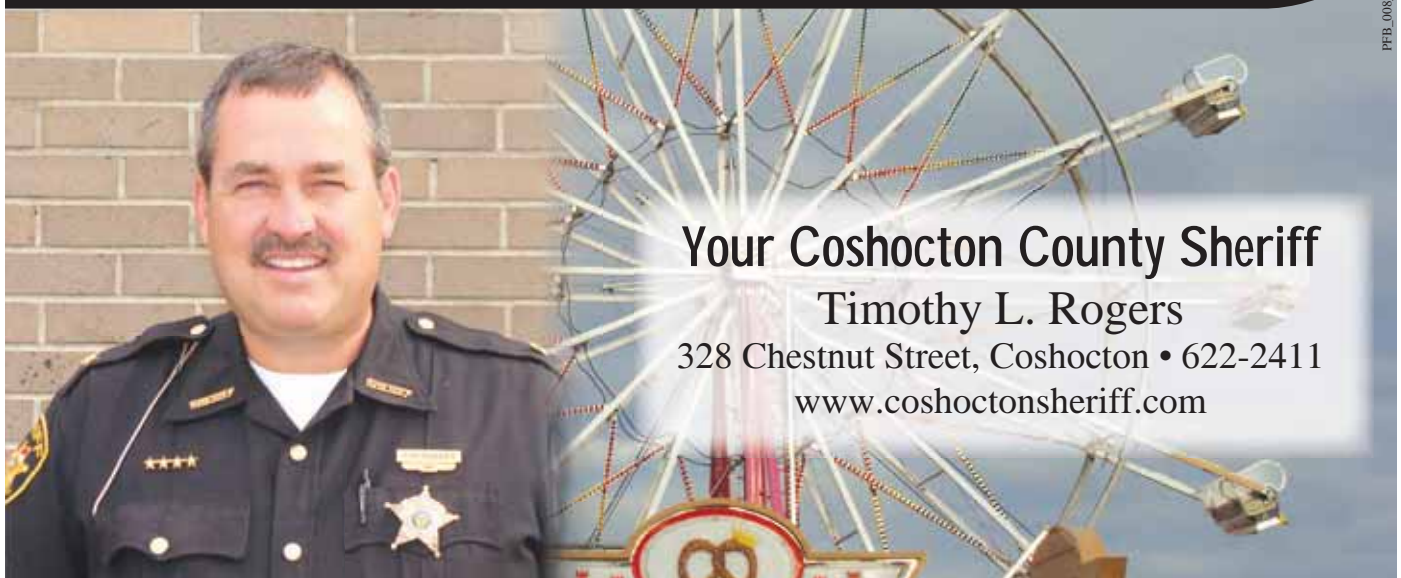

(Judge may request second-place animal from class where the champion was selected to be brought in for reserve competition.)

SUPREME FEMALE**RESERVE SUPREME FEMALE****MARKET STEERS, MARKET HEIFERS
AND FEEDER CALF SHOW****FEEDER CALF CLASSES**

1. Animals must be steers (not heifers or bulls) born after Jan. 1, 2013, and in possession and care of the exhibitor by June 16 of the current year. Feeder Calves must be tagged on June 15 at the Feeder Calf Tag-In. Feeder calves must have a halter on when brought to the Feeder Calf Tag-In just inside the Seventh Street gate at the county fairgrounds.
2. All feeder calves must weigh a minimum of 350 pounds. Feeders weighing under the limit or over 800 pounds will show in a separate class and will not be eligible for Champion or Reserve Champion. Feeder calves must weigh 350 pounds to sell through the auction ring.
3. The top five feeder calves in the Large 1, Medium 1 and

Small 1 grade classes will be placed and class winners presented a trophy. A Champion and Reserve Champion Feeder Calf will be selected and have the option to sell through the Junior Fair Sale.

4. All feeder calves must be treated at least 21 days before the start of the fair as follows: Vaccinated for IBR and PI3; vaccinated for BVD; vaccinated for seven-way Clostridia; and treated for internal parasites with Eprinex. These requirements must be met to show in the Junior Fair Beef Show Feeder Calf Classes or sell at the Coshocton County Junior Fair Auction.

5. Exhibitor may enter a maximum of two beef feeder calves and two dairy feeder calves.

RATE OF GAIN

1. All Market Steers must be weighed on first Saturday in February.
2. Each Exhibitor may weigh up to three animals.
3. All animals must weigh a minimum of 900 pounds at time of fair.
4. Five Rate of Gain trophies will be awarded to exhibitors of the top five gaining market steers regardless of breed. The top overall gainer will receive a larger trophy.

OLD TIMERS BEEF SHOWMANSHIP

This class is open to anyone who is 19 years of age or older. Showman is required to be a 4-H or FFA parent, advisor, sponsor or involved in Coshocton County 4-H or FFA activities during the past year. Judging will be strictly on the showmanship of the individual and not on the animal. It is NOT required that the showman own the animal which they exhibit in this class. The class may be divided if necessary.

CLASS 1 - SENIOR SHEEP FITTING (Age 14 and over)

BOOK 521 - MARKET LAMB SHOW

1. All market lambs must be tagged on the Market Lamb Weigh-in Day on June 15. At the June Market Lamb weigh-in day, all lambs must have a scrapie tag and all wethers must have been surgically cut or banded. Only ewes and wether market lambs meeting these criteria will be tagged.
2. All sheep are required to have a scrapie tag (preferably in the left ear).
3. Market lamb classes can be divided by weight at the discretion of the superintendent. All weight sections are considered an entry in Class 1.
4. Market lambs must be slick shorn with a maximum of 1/4 inch of wool. Wool length will be checked at the fair weigh-in.
5. Each exhibitor may tag and weigh in a total of six market lambs. Only four lambs may be brought to the fair with two being single market lamb entries. All four lambs must be shown.
6. Exhibitors may enter two pairs of lambs in the Pen of Two Market Lambs. The two single market lambs may be a pair if entered in the pen of two. Market lamb exhibitors must designate at the fair weigh-in which lambs will be Market Lambs. The average weight of the Pen of Two lambs will be used to break the classes for Pen of Two.
7. All market lambs (Junior Fair and Open Class) must be weighed at the fair.
8. Market lamb class weight ranges will be printed in the Junior Fair Sheep Show book.
9. Any Market Lamb exhibitor not wishing to show in the Carcass Show and Champion Drive must notify the show advisor before the animals enter the ring for Champion Drive. Final placings of these market Champion Drive must go to the Carcass Show.
- 2012 Junior Fair Market Lamb Show Champion Drive – Selection of Grand Champion Market Lamb, Reserve Grand Champion Market Lamb and 10 additional market lambs for the Carcass Show. After an exhibitor has one animal in the Champion Drive selected for the Carcass Show, then he has the choice to withdraw his second animal in that Champion Drive.

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
